I. TITLE OF COURSE: AR2113- Interior Design II

II. COURSE DESCRIPTION: Three credit hours

Three credit hours of lecture and Zero credit hours of lab per week.

Interior Design II course is designed to enhance the knowledge obtained in the Design I class. By researching, having guest speakers, lectures, new developments, and going on field trips this class will deepen the students understanding and knowledge of specific areas of Interior Design. Interior Design II may be taken before Interior Design I.

For each unit of credit, a minimum of three hours per week with one of the hours for class and two hours for studying/preparation outside of class is expected.

Pre-requisite: AR1103 Interior Design I
