I. TITLE OF COURSE: ED1003- Directed Independent Studies in Education

II. COURSE DESCRIPTION: One - Three credit hours Zero credit hours of lecture and One - Three credit hours of lab per week.

This course is an independent study for students to investigate topics of education outside of the regular curriculum offering.

For each unit of credit, a minimum of three hours per week with one of the hours for class and two hours for studying/preparation outside of class is expected.
