I. TITLE OF COURSE: MU1413- Finale I: Introduction to Music Notation

II. COURSE DESCRIPTION: Three **credit hours**
Two **credit hours of lecture and One credit hours of lab per week.**

This course is to provide instruction in the use of Finale music notation software.

For each unit of credit, a minimum of three hours per week with one of the hours for class and two hours for studying/preparation outside of class is expected.
